COWS

A pig is a mammal and a farm animal. Pigs have a nose that is called a snout. They have hairy ears.

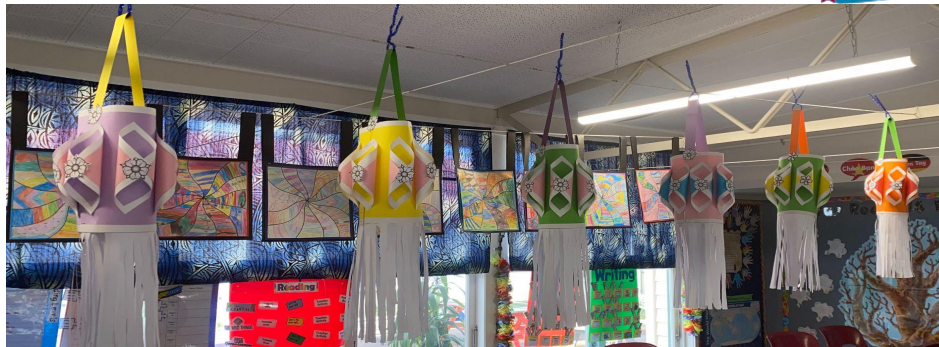
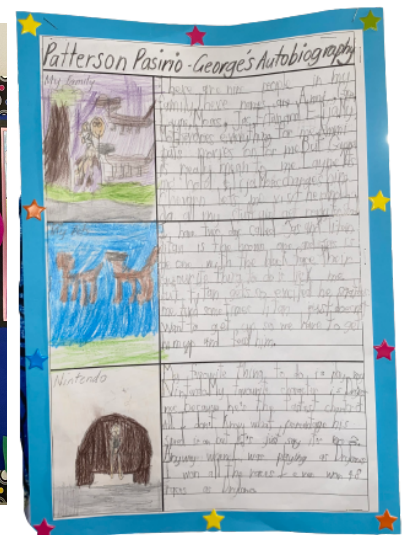
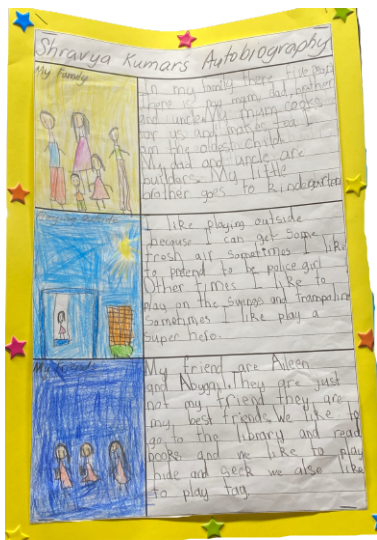
Pigs have little curly tails. Pigs have black and white skin with spots. They have thin hair on their bodies. Sometimes they can grow tusks from their mouths. Farmer only keep pigs for their meal. A female pig is called a sow, they can have a litter of 10 baby piglets or more. The male pig is called boar and a baby pig is called a piglet.



Some people call pigs swine, that is another name for a pig. Sometimes farmers put pigs in sties or a shed. They put dry straw underneath them to make them warm. A pig eats turnips, root vegetables, like boiled potatoes. They drink water or milk. A group of pigs is a herd and a group of piglets is a litter. Pigs go to the sun but they can't get sweaty. They roll in the mud to make themselves cool down because they only have a little bit of hair on their bodies. I think that pigs are useful and strong.

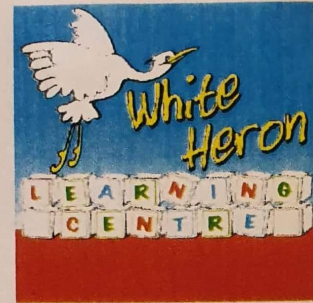
