STUDENTS WORK

DAIRY COWS

Dairy Cows are animals that produce milk by eating grass. They have four stomachs. The people that look after cows are dairy farmers. Dairy farmers make the cows happy when the dairy farmers take care of them. They make sure that the cows are healthy and happy and can make good quality milk. Cows are milked two or three times a day.

It takes ten minutes to milk one cow. The milk from the cows is stored in a refrigerated tank. The refrigerated tank keeps the milk nice and cool. The milk from the cows is picked up in the refrigerated truck and the truck takes the milk to the plant. At the milk plant the milk is pasteurised. They heat the milk to a high temperature to remove any harmful bacteria. After heating the milk they homogenised the milk so then it can be creamy and smooth.

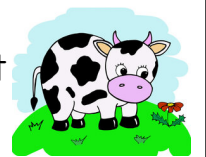


Homogenised is a simple process that mixes and spreads the milk fat to break it down to small pieces. After the process, it's either put into a bottle or a carton. Then it's labelled by the huge machines after it's delivered in the refrigerated truck to the shop.

DAIRY COWS

Dairy Cows are animals that produce milk by eating grass. Dairy farmers have a really important job to do. They have to make sure that the dairy cows are happy and healthy and can produce good quality milk. The cows are milked in a milking shed.



They are milked 2-3 times a day. The milking process only takes ten minutes. After the cows are milked the farmers put all the milk in a refrigerated tank. A refrigerated truck comes to pick up the milk and delivers it to a milk plant. At the milk plant the milk is pasteurised to remove any harmful bacteria. That means the milk is heated to a high temperature.

To keep the milk creamy and smooth we have to homogenise it. Homogenisation is a simple process that mixes and disperses into small pieces. After this process the milk is poured into bottles or cartons. Then the huge machines label them and refrigerated truck delivers them to the shops.

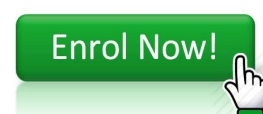
UPDATING CAREGIVER DETAILS

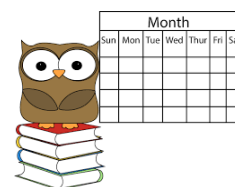
